- HF 2111 Unemployment Tax Collection. Requires Secretary of State to notify the Department of Workforce Development prior to approving a filing for reinstatement by a dissolved company, to ensure any back taxes are paid. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2229 Dental Insurance (Delta Dental Bill). Prohibits dental plans from setting fee schedules for dental services that are not covered by the plan. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2399 Nuclear Power Plants. Makes electric generation source diversity a public policy and allows the IUB flexibility to encourage retrofitting of existing plants to lower carbon emissions and to help MidAmerican Energy plan for future generation in a carbon restricted future, including possible nuclear plants. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2405 Broadband Grants. Allows proprietary information in grant applications to the Iowa Broadband Deployment Governance Board to remain confidential. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2409 IFA Paperwork Reduction. Repeals Iowa Finance Authority requirement that banks file a paper report, as data is available online. (Senate Calendar)
- SF 2073 Banking Division Licensing Boards. Makes changes to the Accountancy, Engineering and Land Surveying, Architectural, Landscape Architectural, Interior Design, and Real Estate Appraiser boards, and the Real Estate Commission. (House Calendar)
- SF 2075 Use of Credit Reports by Insurers. Requires exceptions to the use of credit reports by insurers to set rates or offer policies for those whose credit information was influenced by specified extraordinary life circumstances. (House Calendar)
- SF 2157 Real Estate Installment Sales. Requires real estate installment sales contracts that now must be recorded in 180 days to be recorded within 90 days and those that must now be recorded in 90 days to be recorded within 30 days. (House Calendar)
- SF 2192 Real Estate Transfer Fee Covenants. States that a transfer fee covenant does not run with the title and is not binding on or enforceable against a subsequent owner. Also, a lien to secure payment of a transfer fee on or after 7-1-10 is void. (House Calendar)
- SF 2201 Insurance Division Bill. Omnibus bill makes various noncontroversial changes in matters under the purview of the Insurance Division. (House Calendar)
- SF 2224 Condominium Meetings. Requires meetings to be open to all members with notice either mailed or delivered seven days in advance. (House Calendar)
- SF 2235 Winter Propane Delivery. Requires winter delivery to any LIHEAP eligible customer who has a \$500 cash payment, allowing 75% for new fuel and 25% for any outstanding bill. (House Calendar)
- SF 2272 Insurance Guarantee Associations. Insurance Division bill making various changes to expand coverage under the Iowa Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association and the Iowa Insurance Guaranty Association. (House Calendar)

- SF 2324 Statewide Cable/Video Franchises. Requires more information with an application, gives the IUB more time to review applications, and requires the franchisee to begin operation within 12 months or risk revocation of the franchise. (House Calendar)
- SF 2325 Mortuary Board / Account Audits. Applies Iowa continuing education requirements to out-state-state licensees and requires the buyer of preneed sales accounts to have an audit performed on the accounts with 35 days of the sale. (House Calendar).
- SF 2326 Real Estate Licensee Discipline. Modifies disciplinary provisions to clarify the distinction between provisions relating to initial licensure and those relating to suspension or revocation of the already licensed. (House Calendar)
- SF 2346 Auto Insurance Under/Uninsured Coverage. Prohibits provisions that reduce this coverage if a household member who is a relative is at fault, unless coverage is offered with no such provision. Insurers must also offer the same coverage limits as the consumer purchased for bodily injury liability. (House Calendar)
- SF 2348 Real Estate Closing Agent Licensing. Division of Banking bill that requires licensing of providers of real estate closing services that are neither the lender, seller, purchaser, or borrower. (House Calendar)
- SF 2349 Coverage of Autism Syndrome. Requires the state employee health plan to cover assessment and treatment of autism syndrome disorders for children age 20 and under, up to a maximum of \$36,000 per year. (House Calendar)

- SF 2108 Auto Repair Shop Artisan Liens. Creates an exception to a repair shop's ability to hold a vehicle to force payment of a disputed bill, if the Attorney General decides that the shop violated the auto trade practices law. (Signed by Governor; effective May 1, 2010)
- SF 2191 Banking Division Bill. Omnibus bill makes various noncontroversial changes in matters under the purview of the Banking Division. (Sent to Governor; multiple effective dates)
- SF 2313 Municipal Utilities. Cleanup of statutes that allow municipal utilities to enter into agreements with other entities to jointly finance generation or transmission facilities. (Signed by Governor; effective July 1, 2010)

- HF 2295 Requires the Department of Education to convene a task force to conduct a study of the current system of area education agencies. Membership of the task force is education stakeholders and consumers. A report is due to the General Assembly by December 15, 2010. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2432 Requires the Department of Education and Area Education Agencies (AEA) to conduct a study of the opportunities for recruiting racial and ethnic minority teachers from outside the state. The study is to examine the impact of requiring racial and ethnic minority teachers in communities whose population is less than five percent racial and ethnic minority citizens and communities whose population is greater than five percent. The report is due to the General Assembly by January 10, 2011. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2461 Directs school business managers, hired on or after July 1, 2010, to complete a training program related to the financial operations of a school district. Upon successful completion of the program, they will be issued a school business official authorization by the Board of Educational Examiners. The Department of Education is to convene an advisory committee to determine the standards, procedures, content, and processes of training programs and issue a report to the General Assembly by December 31, 2010. Individuals employed as a school business manager as of July 1, 2012, who meets the requirements of the board, other than the training requirements, will be issued an initial authorization by the board, but are required to take continuing education courses. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2462 Allows school districts to use the board-approved levy (33 cents per thousand valuation) of Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL) funds for purposes in addition to those already in current law. These include the purchase or lease of computers or computer-related equipment, technical support, and computer software and the repair costs of any equipment purchased with PPEL funds. (Senate Calendar – attached to SF 2290)
- HF 2492 Technical Code cleanup bill from the Department of Education. (House Calendar attached to SF 2288)
- SF 2178 Allows state funds allocated to nonpublic schools for textbooks to also be used for laptop computers or other portable personal computing devices. There is no new funding in the bill. (House Calendar)
- SF 2289 Allows the director of the Department of Education to order the positive fund balances held by a deaccredited school district (a school district being closed) to be transferred to the school's general fund if the general fund has a negative balance. Also, adds language in session law to authorize certain fund transfers. (House Calendar)
- SF 2288 Technical Code cleanup bill from the Department of Education. (House Calendar – attached to HF 2492 on House Calendar)
- SF 2290 Allows school districts to use the board-approved levy (33 cents per thousand valuation) of Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL) funds for purposes in addition to those

already in current law. These include the purchase or lease of computers or computer-related equipment, technical support, and computer software and the repair costs of any equipment purchased with PPEL funds. (Senate Calendar – attached to HF 2462)

- HF 2030 Requires school districts to spend down their cash reserve funds before coming to the School Budget Review Committee to levy for modified allowable growth which could increase property taxes. (signed; effective 1/20/10)

- HF 2372 Provides that a person that commits an assault without the intent to inflict serious injury, but who causes serious injury, commits a Class D felony. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2374 Conforms the definition of “serious injury” throughout the Iowa Code to Iowa Code Section 702.18 regarding definitions in the Iowa Code. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2377 Allows a judge to extend a period of probation for up to one year, including a one year period the maximum period of probation. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2392 Transfers some abuse of a corpse provisions from the code chapters dealing with sexual abuse to code chapters dealing with assault. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2438 Increases the penalty for attempting to entice a minor reasonably believed to be under age of 13 to a Class C felony and attempting to entice a minor reasonably believed to be under age of 16 to a Class D felony. The bill requires a person to commit an overt act to entice a minor to be convicted of attempting to entice a minor. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2452 Allows greater freedom and streamlines the process for the DOT to issue temporary restricted licenses, including the requirements for ignition interlock devices, for violations of operating while intoxicated laws. (Senate Calendar) (Companion to SF 2251 on Senate Calendar)
- HF 2453 Treats a posthumously conceived and born child of parents that were married at the time of the death of one of the parents as if the child is deemed the legitimate child of both parents. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2473 Expands the definition of criminal mischief in the third degree to include a person that intentionally injures, destroys, disturbs, or removes any marker placed by a licensed land surveyor. (Senate Calendar)

- HF 2478 Makes changes to provisions regulating the formulation and management of limited liability companies (LLC) under Iowa Code Chapter 489. (Senate Calendar)
- HF 2483 Makes changes to the trust and estate law, including provisions relating to state inheritance tax, uniform transfers to minors, and medical assistance claims. (House Calendar) (Companion to SF 2309 on Senate Calendar)
- SF 358 Implements the “Uniform Foreign-Country Money Judgments Recognition Act” to provide for uniform enforcement of foreign-country judgments in state courts. (House Calendar)
- SF 2096 Allows for the revocation and amendment of premarital agreements relating to post-death matters. (Senate Calendar) (Companion to HF 2234 on House Calendar)
- SF 2109 Adds failure to obey an official traffic control device as a simple misdemeanor offense that can be subject to additional fines and licensing sanctions if the violation causes an injury or death. (House Calendar)
- SF 2190 Allows a bankruptcy debtor that is an Iowa resident to exempt up to \$1,000 of any personal property, unlike current law that limits the exemption to any personal property not specifically exempted in Code Chapter 627. (House Calendar)
- SF 2200 Makes changes to transfer of guardianships in Child in Need of Assistance cases to probate courts. (House Calendar)
- SF 2223 Requires the court to authorize the commencement of a court proceeding through conviction, final judgment, or decree if a party is unable to pay the fees and costs of the proceeding. (House Calendar)
- SF 2250 Creates a nonforcible Class D felony for robbery in the third degree if a person commits a simple misdemeanor assault while perpetrating a robbery. (House Calendar)
- SF 2251 Allows greater freedom and streamlines the process for the DOT to issue temporary restricted licenses, including the requirements for ignition interlock devices, for violations of operating while intoxicated laws. (Senate Calendar) (Companion to HF 2452 on House Calendar)
- SF 2252 Creates a Public Safety Advisory Board. (House Calendar)
- SF 2298 Creates a presumption it is in the best interests of a child at least 14 years of age to attend all hearings and meetings related to juvenile court proceedings. (House Calendar)
- SF 2306 Grants visitation rights to grandparents or great-grandparents. (House Calendar)
- SF 2309 Makes changes to the trust and estate law, including provisions relating to state inheritance tax, uniform transfers to minors, and medical assistance claims. (Senate Calendar) (Companion to HF 2483 on House Calendar)
- SF 2343 Relates to the appointment of judicial officers, senior judges, court reporters, and clerks of the district court and creates a full time magistrate office. (House Calendar)
- SF 2345 Relates to the administration of the judicial branch. (Senate Calendar, with House Amendment)
- SF 2351 Makes it a class D felony for a person to commit domestic abuse by choking or blocking the normal breathing or circulation of blood. (House Calendar)
- SF 2352 Requires hospitals to notify law enforcement of the planned discharge of a person with a serious mental impairment if the hospital has been requested to provide notice by administrative form or court order. (House Calendar)
